Through a collaboration with the NC Wildlife Resources Commission, NC Wildlife Federation, and the NC chapter of the American Society of Landscape Architects the Woodbridge neighborhood worked to meet the criteria necessary to become one of only two NC Wildlife Friendly Communities in the state. Their commitment to sustainability and the promotion of native plants replenishes resources and restores habitats for local wildlife.

EXTENDED ROAD CLOSURE

Country Club Drive NE

Beginning April 12, 2023





A portion of Country Club Drive NE will be closed to thru traffic between Branchview Drive NE (HWY 3) and Concord Parkway N (HWY 29) beginning April 12, 2023 and lasting approximately 9 months to allow a culvert to be replaced. Businesses and residences on Country Club Drive will remain accessible during the closure.

There will be two detours in place during the closure on Lake Concord Road and Concord Parkway N.

Extended Road Closure at County Club Drive NE

Friendly reminder, plan accordingly for your commute if you use Country Club Drive. While a culvert is being replaced, a portion of Country Club Drive NE will be closed to through traffic beginning April 12 and lasting approximately 9 months. All residences and businesses will remain accessible during construction.

The City of Concord Government, Cabarrus County, and Goodwill Industries of the Southern Piedmont will host a free Safe Disposal Event on Saturday, April 29, 2023, from 9 a.m. to 11 a.m. at the Village Parking Lot (280 Concord Parkway N. in Concord). Residents will be able to safely dispose of paper (shredding is limited to 5 trash bags or banker boxes per person), electronic waste (televisions, computers, and other devices), and unused or expired medications.
