**Burrage Road
Rehabilitation**

City of Concord to Rehabilitate Burrage Road

The City of Concord has awarded a contract to rehabilitate Burrage Road from Lake Concord Road to the new bridge over Three Mile Branch. In order to complete this work, the new bridge needed to be substantially complete to facilitate hauling while avoiding schedule conflicts or damage claims from the bridge contractor. The funding for the two projects are from separate sources: the bridge project primarily from federal dollars and the rehabilitation project from City transportation project funds. This along with different record keeping requirements warranted two separate contracts. During the time of the bridge work, the right-of-way for the rehabilitation project was being acquired. By using separate contractors, the City saved over \$400,000.

Project Description

The existing roadway is concrete and has deficiencies that need repair. The only efficient way to repair the concrete roadway is to remove the concrete, reestablish the existing subgrade, and pave with asphalt. The project will also include installing new curb and gutter and concrete sidewalk.

New Roadway

The new roadway will be 32 feet wide measured face of curb to face of curb. Lane width will be 14 feet. The concrete sidewalk will be 6 feet wide and will be continuous on the south side of the roadway from Lake Concord Road to Three Mile Branch.

Construction Duration/Detour

Construction is scheduled to begin in February 2015, and finish by July 2015. During construction, Burrage Road will be closed in the vicinity of the project. The detour currently in place will remain for this project. The contractor is required to maintain access to the church, businesses, medical facilities, and homes on Burrage Road within the project.
