<u> Strategic Plan – Next Step</u>

The Mayor and Council completed the next step in the Strategic Plan update process.

Dorton Park Renovation Project

The City Manager stated staff worked with the consultant, J.D. Goodrum, to develop options for the restroom location.

Staff with J.D. Goodrum were in attendance and presented the alternate location options, costs and timelines to the Mayor and Council. They stated Alternate 1, the renovation of existing restroom, would increase the project cost by \$55,000 and extend the timeline by 6 months; Alternate 2 would increase the cost of the project and would extend the timeline to April 2025; Alternate 3, removal of the restroom, would result in a credit of \$170,000 back to the City and the remaining renovations would be completed.

Following discussion, a motion was made by Council Member Crawford and seconded by Council Member King to accept Alternate 1—the vote: aye – King, McKenzie, Crawford, and Parsley-Hubbard; nay – Langford, Stocks and Sweat.
