Subject: Face Covering Requirement

On June 24<sup>th</sup> North Carolina Governor Roy Cooper signed [Executive Order 147](#) which extended the Phase 2 business reopening restrictions until at least July 17<sup>th</sup> and, as of June 26<sup>th</sup> at 5 PM, requires individuals to wear a face covering when out in public. Please read the attached executive order for all the specific details, definitions, and exemptions.

Section II B 6 of Executive Order 147 states that all employees, passengers, and individuals at North Carolina airports must wear a Face Covering when within six (6) feet of another person, unless in a personal vehicle. Notwithstanding these requirements, no customer will be removed from or denied entry to public transportation for failure to wear a Face Covering.

Concord-Padgett Regional Airport takes Covid-19 seriously and has implemented CDC recommended safety measures, practices, and extra cleanings in our facilities. All City of Concord Aviation Department staff will be wearing face coverings when within six feet of another person or when in public areas of our terminal buildings.

We request that all individuals, including any employee, customer, contractor, or guest follow the requirements outlined in Executive Order 147 when on airport property. The City of Concord will provide a mask for any individual who are at the airport and do not have a face covering. Masks can be obtained at our Customer Service Desk in either are commercial or general aviation terminals.

Together, by everyone following these requirements and guidelines, we can reduce the spread of COVID-19 and hopefully get back to normal operations sooner rather than later.
