## General Information for 2015

Camp *GoneAlot*, for 2015, is an eight-week program for 11 - 13 year olds. This program operates June 22 to August 14, 2015.

### **Program Hours**

7:30 a.m. until 6:00 p.m., Monday - Friday. A late fee of \$5.00 per each 15 minutes past 6:00 p.m. must be paid at that time.

### **Registration Fees**

\$350.00/child for City of Concord residents

\$450.00/child for Non-City residents

To qualify as a City resident, child or parent/legal guardian must reside within the City Limits of Concord. Program fee includes all trips and program offerings and must be paid in full by JUNE 5TH. No refunds will be given after JUNE 5TH.

Camp *GoneAlot* will be filled on a first-come, first-served basis. There is a limit of 60 registered children per site, making our staff to participant ratio 1 to 15.

### **Participant Forms**

A parent or legal guardian must sign the Summer Playground 2014 Participant Form (trip permission, pool rules, and Discipline and Behavior Management Policy, Electronic Devices and Dress Code Policies). Copies will be made available at the time of registration, either on-line on the Parent's Page or at the Academy Recreation Center.

### **Parent's Page on Website**

The Parent's Page, found at [www.concordparksandrec.org](http://www.concordparksandrec.org) includes the Parent Manual, participant forms and each weeks newsletter. It can be accessed by clicking on the *Programs/Activities* button at the top of the home page, then scrolling down to the *Summer Camps* button. Parent's access to the Parent's Page is by the password: ready2play.

## **Drop Off and Pick Up**

Please come inside and sign the Daily Sign in/out sheet when dropping off or picking up your child each day. ***Your child cannot sign in or out.*** The sheet will be located in a designated area at each site. Be sure to inform the leader in charge when another person will be picking up your child.

Person picking up participants should be identified by the parent/legal guardian on the registration form.

## **Snacks & Lunches**

Snacks, water bottle and lunch, clearly labeled with child's name, should be in suitable containers. No glass bottles or breakable containers are allowed. Refrigerators are not available. Perishable items should be brought in small coolers. Vending machines are available at the recreation facilities.

Morning and afternoon breaks for snack time are offered by your child's site. Lunchtime varies between 11:30 a.m. and 1:30 p.m. depending on the day's activities.

## **Clothing and Personal Belongings**

Please have your child dressed appropriately for the activities of the day. **Always** have your child bring a pair of socks.

Flip-flops or sandals are not allowed at the sites with the exception of the pool. We suggest they wear laced up tennis shoes for comfort and safety.

Participants are responsible for belongings brought to Summer Playground. *We do not allow Gameboys, Walkmans, jewelry and other valuables that are subject to theft.* **We are not responsible for lost or stolen items. Please label all personal belongings with your child's full name in permanent ink.**

## **Field Trips**

All trip fees are included in the registration fee. If optional activities are available to our participants you will be notified of those activities and costs involved so you can determine if your child can participate and how much extra money to give your child. This information should be listed in the weekly newsletter available on Fridays of the preceding week.

Spending money for snacks and souvenirs is your child's responsibility. The leaders are NOT responsible for participant's money or how much they spend on field trips.

Please be considerate of the scheduled departure times listed in the weekly newsletter. We will be unable to delay the group on scheduled field trips if you are late getting your child to the site.

**It is MANDATORY that participants wear their Camp GoneAlot t-shirt on designated field trips.**

### **Weekly Newsletter**

Each site will have a weekly newsletter that will contain a daily listing of the week's events. It will include all field trips and activities away from camp and what times the bus departs and returns to the site. The newsletter will be available on Fridays beside the daily sign in/out sheet for parents to pick up. ### **Swimming**

Each site will swim at the John F. McInnis Aquatic Center twice a week. Certified lifeguards and the program leaders will supervise during swim time.

All participants will be given a swim test the first day of swimming. Those who are able to swim the length of the pool will receive a colored armband designating the ability to swim and play in the deep area of the pool. Participants who were not able to swim the length the first day are given the opportunity to test again when they chose. *If you chose for your child not to be allowed in the water, please let us know in writing.*

If your child is sensitive to the sun, ***please send sunscreen for swimming days.*** Don't forget to label sunscreen and towels with your child's name.

### **Sunscreen**

Please send sunscreen for you camper daily. We are not responsible for providing or applying sunscreen. Campers are responsible for applying their own sunscreen. Only if a spray bottle form is provided will a leader assist in spraying on sunscreen. Campers should be able to rub in their own sunscreen as we will not assist them.

## **Miscellaneous**

Campers for Summer Playground should be potty trained, able to tie their shoes, and dressed ready to play each day. Summer Playground is an action packed camp full of a variety of games, activities and trips. Our leaders are not responsible for changing the clothing of any participants, or changing under garments or diapers. Please send your camper prepared each day as we fill our schedule with as much fun as possible on a daily basis and need to stay on schedule to be respectful to the time of you as parents, and the vendors we travel to.

## **Medication**

Leaders are not responsible for and will not be distributing, holding, or carrying prescribed or over the counter medication of any kind.

# Discipline and Behavior Management

## **Positives for Summer Playground Participants**

**Parents, please review these positives with your children. In order to insure the care, welfare, and safety of all Playground participants, they will be expected to follow the following basic rules:**

- Use your manners and treat staff and fellow participants with respect.
- Obey your leaders and follow their instructions.
- Keep your hands, feet, and objects to yourself.
- Respect the property of other participants and that of your site.
- Always stay with your group.
- Be responsible for personal property brought to Summer Playground.
- Be on your best behavior on field trips and during special events and programs.
- Have tons of fun, make new friends, enjoy the field trips, laugh with your Leaders....have a great summer at Summer Playground.

## Negatives for Summer Playground Participants

**To ensure the safety of all Playground participants, certain inappropriate**

behavior cannot be tolerated. The following are behaviors, which will result in a participant's suspension or termination from the program:

- Profanity or vulgar language will not be tolerated.
- Hurting others and oneself will not be tolerated.
- Threatening violence will not be tolerated.
- Stealing will not be tolerated.
- Jeopardizing the health and safety of others will not be tolerated.
- Disturbing programs and special events with inconsiderate behavior will not be tolerated.
- Destruction of property will not be tolerated.
- Weapons of any kind will not be tolerated.
- The presence of drugs, narcotics, alcohol or tobacco will not be tolerated.

If such behaviors occur, parents will receive a Disciplinary Action Notice and will be expected to support and work with the Playground Leaders.

## Discipline Policy "Three Strikes, You're Out"

It is our goal to keep all the participants in our program safe throughout the summer. In order to ensure their safety, the following Discipline Policy has been developed. Leaders at each site will determine what rules are necessary for their playground. They, of course, will work to prevent problems by keeping participants busy at all times with organized activities. Additionally, leaders will use many alternatives to deter unwanted actions and encourage appropriate behavior. Our policy for disciplinary measures is as follows:

### **STRIKE ONE - First Infraction** of the rules:

- verbal warning** and reminder of established rules

### **STRIKE TWO - Second Infraction** of the rules or repeated disobedience within a brief time frame:

- loss of privileges** from an activity
- parents notified by the leader in charge. A Disciplinary Action Notice will be filled out and presented to the parent for his/her signature at the time of pickup. The Notice will spell out in detail how the leader in charge will handle the next infraction.

### **STRIKE THREE - Third Infraction** or repeated disruptive behavior:

- suspension** from Summer Playgrounds.
- Parents notified by the leader in charge. A written suspension form will be filled out and signed by the parent at pickup.

### **SERIOUS INFRACTION**

- automatic expulsion** from the program. All money paid will be forfeited. Parents will be contacted for a parent conference.

We consider the following to be a **SERIOUS INFRACTION**: Stealing, having weapons of any kind, having the presence of drugs, narcotics, alcohol or tobacco products, repeating profanity, harm to another camper or leader, and a **second offense to the Third Infraction**.

The City of Concord Parks & Recreation Department retains the right to have a participant leave our program with the option of permanent expulsion from the program as defined in the City of Concord Parks and Recreation policy if there is a discipline problem. Refunds will not be given for children asked to leave the program for disciplinary reasons.

## Rules of the John F. McInnis Aquatic Center

1. All persons must take a soap and water shower before entering the water.
2. Please lock all belongings in the lockers provided in the locker rooms. The City of Concord is not responsible for lost or stolen items.
3. No street clothes will be allowed in the pool.
4. All persons must wear appropriate swimming attire when in and around the pool. This includes but is not limited to the following: No thong bathing suits, no sheer or otherwise transparent short or tops, no shorts with buttons, snaps, metal zippers or threads hanging. All suits must be of appropriate size to adequately cover the necessary areas. Persons not adhering to this policy will be asked to leave until appropriate swimwear can be obtained. Only light colored lightweight t-shirts will be allowed OVER a bathing suit to offer sun protection.
5. No persons shall use the pool unless a lifeguard is on duty.
6. All patrons will respond to lifeguard instructions immediately upon hearing the whistle. Failure to follow the lifeguard's instructions will result in suspension for 1 year.
7. No persons with open cuts, sores or bandages as well as anyone with a communicable disease will be allowed to swim.
8. No eyeglasses shall be worn in the pool unless they are of unbreakable material, necessary for safety and approved by the pool manager.
9. No diving or jumping into the pool at any time. Intentional infractions will result in suspension of 1 year.
10. No playing on ropes.
11. Please put all trash in the containers provided.
12. No glass or other object that might cause injury are allowed in the pool area.
13. Abusive or foul language will not be tolerated. Suspension of 1 year.
14. Inflatable floats will be allowed however the lifeguard on duty has the final decision regarding placement and supervision of such floats.
15. Employees only are allowed in the office.
16. All children 8 and under will be accompanied by an adult when in and around the pool.
17. No smoking in or around the pool area. Smoking will be permitted on the front lawn of the facility only.
18. No person under the influence of narcotics or alcohol will be permitted in or around the pool.
19. Sunbathers must be 6 feet from the edge of the pool.
20. No animals area allowed in the pool area.

Anyone suspended from City of Concord Parks and Recreation facility and caught on any City property during the period of suspension will have the suspension time doubled and be subject to arrest.
